 - Bob Gilbert—The Club expects to field a table at the Prospect Park Bike Day event, scheduled for the weekend after Memorial Day with plenty of NYCC publicity and marketing materials.

 - Colin Taber–Regarding the Berkshire weekend, Ron Grossberg is coordinating and is engaged in finding a new dining venue. Rides are being posted.
- 3. NJ Bike Walk Summit Steve Vaccaro attended and reported. In the current climate of federal defunding, pressure can be brought to bear on states to do similar, removing initiatives from legislative action. We may be facing challenging times for increasing bike infrastructure, maintaining what is already in place, and furthering the rollout of dual-use access (bikes/cars; bikes/pedestrians) in our parks, on our bridges, city streets...
