2	Club Reserve Funds	The potential need to absorb the cost of the unused West Point weekend rooms could do serious damage to the club's reserves How can we raise extra funds? • We could potentially take a portion of ENY profit. ○ It has been customary for ENY committee to decide which charities to donate funds to ○ ENY uses club resources for free (web site, etc) ○ Does the board need to justify or explain a decision to take a portion of ENY profit? • We could raise our membership fees ○ Our membership is very cheap compared to value received and compared to other clubs • We could charge a fee for the SIGS ○ This could open up potential issues and complaints (what if member is dropped, do they get their fee back?) ○ This could interfere with the spirit of the SIGS and the overall goal to introduce more people to riding

4 Ride Sign-ups and Potential Changes to Web Site and Policy	What are the issues with ride sign-ups on the web site and how might we fix these issues? Certain members sign up for rides weeks or months in advance Even several weeks before the date of a given ride, that ride can be filled and have a wait list Members often sign-up for multiple wait-lists If a spot on a ride on which they are waitlisted becomes available, members can forget to remove themselves from other wait-lists for rides on the same day If members could only sign-up for a short period in advance of the ride, the issues listed above would lessen But how long should that window be? At least enough to cover a week and a weekend What about 10 days? What about 2 weeks? Should we limit members to 2 waitlists for a given day? What about "My Ride Page" Members could see a view that shows all the rides they have signed up for and all the rides they are waitlisted on Should we make the size of the wait-list invisible to members? This might prevent members from being discouraged from signing up for sold-out rides Ride leaders/coordinators would still be able to see this information Many of the problems described above would significantly reduce or go away with: the awareness that a My Ride Page would bring a limited window for ride sign-ups We are in the process of putting together the statistics on who has signed-up for what ride, We should penalize people who sign up for rides and then don't show up Let leaders/ride coordinators suspend privileges	

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5	Defining Ride Styles	We don't want to redesign the ride rating system, but some clarification might be useful	
		We need two or three axes to define a ride • Skill/speed or • Skill/speed/style	
		Another variable is the difficulty of the ride including how many feet of climbing • Rides in the ride library have a rating that indicates the difficulty of the terrain	
		 Other points: Decisions can be made if you know the ride leaders Historically, the designation of A/B/C has been made based on how it takes the rider to complete 4 loops in Central Park 	
		We (Israel, Manual and Ken) drafted ride style descriptions, but we never really agreed and they have not been finalized	
		 Typical topics of discussion: Can you have an A18? Yes the A suggests a double pace line ride style What does it mean 18? Typical average speed on flats It seems generally accepted that at the end of a ride, your odometer should read 3mph less than designated ride speed Split speeds are confusing Maybe ok for 30 people ride that will split up into 2 groups
