

In December 1975, my opponent was elected President of the NYCC. Three months later, in the face of pressure from the ENTIRE Board of Directors charging him with obstructing every effort for growth and activity in the Club, he resigned under fire. To save his feelings, it was reported to the membership that he was resigning "due to personal reasons."

I was elected President by the Board as his successor—and as the politicians say, let's look at the record. In March 1976, the membership was less than 200, and the Long Island Bicycle Club had been born as the result of a split due in large part to my opponent's almost paranoid concern with the minutiae of the Club's By-Laws, Eight months later, the membership has soared to 370, with new members joining daily—even in the frigid days of November and December.

The Club has pulsed with activities during these last eight months. The creation of the Manhattan Rides Committee; the expansion of the rides program to include B & C rides as well as Century and Double Centuries; the Klub-Kliniks, designed to help our newer and less experienced members; the improvements in the Monthly Bulletin in layout, content, and neatness; the Bike-Trains which capitalized on a concept by the AYH more than a dozen years ago; the up-coming Bikers Bash and Fashion Show--all of these have come about since March 1976.

My program is clear. I believe that the NYCC should be New York's bicycle club for all bicyclists--regardless of age, race, sex, creed, cost of bicycle-or how far you can ride. If you enjoy riding a bike with other people, there is a
place for you in the New York Cycle Club.

Moderate riders enjoy them, and inexperienced riders can easily build up to them. To this end, I'm planning a series of early season training rides to increase the riding capabilities of newcomers to the sport.

I invite you all to work with me and with a representative Board, in which diverse views will be respectfully considered, to shape our program of rides and club activities for the mutual enjoyment of the entire membership.

FOR VICE PRESIDENT

As Vice President I will work to bring all interests in the club together. Although we have a large and varied membership, we all share one common interest --- a love of bikeriding. My main hope is that we can quickly solve any disputes we now have and get back to concentrating on our bikes.

1976 Auditors Report - N.Y.C.C.

At the request of the NYCC Board of Directors, and in accordance with the Club bylaws. I performed a comprehensive audit of the Club's financial records of the period ending September 30th, '976. The results of this audit have been forwarded to the Board via the Club President. Breifly stated, the audit showed the following:

- 1. The records of the Club are in order. The Treasurer's report through this period is correct, but should be adjusted downward by \$57.98, primarily due to timing differences in the receipts and disbusements relative to the closing date of this statement.
- 2. The latest submitted accounting for expenditures on Bike Train II are correct, but should be adjusted upward by some \$26.00 due to a previous miscalculation and subsequent payment to the Club.
- 3. In order to avoid future problems: a) each person who is responsible for handling of Club-related funds should keep a full accounting of all receipts and disbursements, and b) the Club books be reviewed and updated on a monthly rather than quarterly basis.
