## GUIDELINES FOR CLUB RIDES

NYCC rides are intended to be friendly group rides; we don't like to "drop" or lose anyone. Riders whose physical or bicycle condition seem inadequate for the ride are to be turned back by the leader. Our leaders are truly reluctant to do this, so please cooperate with them:

- 1) Select rides within your capabilities - avoid downgrading the ride for your fellow riders and stressing yourself "trying to keep up"; or, conversely, demanding a faster pace than advertised.
- 2) Be on time or a bit early. Rides will leave promptly.
- 3) Have your bike in good condition: both brakes working, properly inflated tires, adjusted derailleurs, no loose parts.
- 4) Bring water, snacks, spare tube, patch kit, pump and lights for after dark.

"B":	TOURISTS: Moderate to brisk riding along scenic roads, including hills; destination not so important. Stops every hour or two.	11-14 mph
"C":	SIGHTSEERS: Leisurely to moderate riding. Destination oriented: nature, historical, cultural. Stops every half to one hour.	8-11 mph
"D":	BEGINNERS: Very leisurely sightseeing. Discovering bike and their bodies; training up to "C". Frequent stopping and regrouping. Do not believe reports of mere mortals riding 100 miles or more in a day.	less than 3 mph

"A-" 90 mi Broadway for a ride up the east side of the Hudson via Anthony's Nose to  
7:30 am Bear Mountain and down the west side of the Hudson. There will be a lunch  
stop at the Bear Mountain Inn.

Sun Aug 1 LAKE HOPATCONG Leaders: Jim Rex (278-5562) and Ed Schweber (567-2661).  
"A+" 134 mi Meet at the Central Park Boathouse for a prompt 6:00 am (yes, 6:00 am)  
6:00am departure. Lake Hopatcong is a pretty resort lake on the border between  
Morris and Sussex Counties. The route is via the George Washington Bridge  
and approaches the Lake from the north. It is very scenic and very hilly.

Sat Aug 28 "B" 35 mi 8:30 am OLD WESTBURY GARDENS (SCOTTISH DAY GAMES) Leader: Barbara Bates (932-6334) Meet Barbara Bates at 8:30 am at Kissena Blvd. and the Long Island Expressway Service Road (southeast corner) in Queens for an 8:45 am prompt departure. We will ride at 12 mph out along the L.I.E. Service Road, through Port Washington and Roslyn. Return will be by I.U. Willetts and the L.I.E. Service Road. Admission to the Gardens is \$3, admission to the house is \$2. Guided tours are provided at no additional charge. Special events of the day will be performed by the Long Island Scottish Clans Association (soccer, bag pipes, races, etc.). Flowers expected to be in

bloom are hollyhocks, salvia, aster and helenium. Plan to spend about 3-4 hours at the Gardens. It is essential that all riders come with lock and chain. Also, carry or buy lunch in Roslyn (picnic facility provided), bring admission monies, pump, spare tube and patch kit.

The hardest task of managing riders' support agen fell on the always able shoulders of "Eagle Scout" Martin Karrin; assisted by his wife Joan, Barbara Silverstein, Barbara Bates, and Andrew Tholk. Most help in organizing the team I got from Jim Boyd, while we missed the capacity of Peter Schaaf, the efficiency of Chris Mailing and Ken Abramson who had other commitments.

With 97% humidity, overcastsky, heavy rain forecast; the event wasn't attended by the usual mob, thus making it more favorable and probably safer for the hard core riders.

Toga Team paced "Ironman" John Howard to a new North American Record of 475 miles, breaking Lee Phoenix's 1978 Syracuse unpaced performance by 5 miles. Obviously Howard outclassed easily all other riders by a wide margin, while Phoenix had to fight it out with his previous record holder Jim Black by comparison.

Having trained on 71" fixed gear a lot; as usual, I rode alone most of the event with one improvement. After 205 miles the lowest gear I used was 67", compared to 60" last year, and 54" two years ago.

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### BICYCLE LINK UP #2

Martha Ramos

This ride is a variation of B.L. #1 and can be ridden by itself or done in a longer version by combining the first half of route #1 with this route.

**RIDE:** THE TRIPLE PLAY TOUR (N.Y. to N.J. to S.I.) 30 -35 miles

**STARTING POINT:** Manhattan side of the George Washington Bridge → at the end of the N.J. side of the Bridge a Left onto Hudson Terrace → bear Right onto Main St. → Left onto Gerome Ave. → Right onto Whitman → Left onto Anderson → Left onto Riverdale → Right onto Abbott Blvd. → follow Abbott until you encounter a school yard between Columbia and Warren Aves.. Look for the curb cut, dismount the bike and enter the school yard. Remount the bike and exit by riding through to the other end of the school yard. You will encounter a series of parking lot areas, one after the other. It is possible to ride through them. Follow this route until you appear to reach the end of this path and then bear to the right where you will see a narrow one lane roadway. Continue on this pathway which runs for about a block and you will exit at the intersection of Gorge Rd. → bear Left onto Gorge Rd. (fantastic decent to River Rd.) → bear Right onto River Rd. → Follow to Hillside Ave. (moderate up hill climb) → becomes 60th St. → remain on 60th St. → Left onto Palisade → Right onto Beacon → Left onto Baldwin → becomes Summit which becomes Garfield → Right onto W. 55th St. → Left onto Ave. B → Right onto W. 37th St. → across JFK Blvd. and onto Ave. A → follow Ave. A → Left at W. 4th St. to the Bayonne Bridge entrance. Up a flight of stairs to the Bridge pathway. Follow pathway into Staten Island. You will exit onto Morningstar Rd. → Right onto Morningstar → Right onto Richmond Terrace → Follow the Terrace to the Ferry entrance → Left to the ferry dock and your free ride to Battery Park in Manhattan.

PLEASE NOTE: You will either pass or be a short detour away from a number of parks on this route, including: Lincoln Park, Hudson County Park, Snug Harbor (S.I.) and Liberty State Park where you will get a unique view of the Statue of Liberty - the backside of this famous landmark. Ferries can be taken from Liberty Park to visit both the Statue and Ellis Island.

Once in S.I. you might desire a brief stop at the Seduto ice cream factory on Richmond Terrace between Park and Heberton Aves..

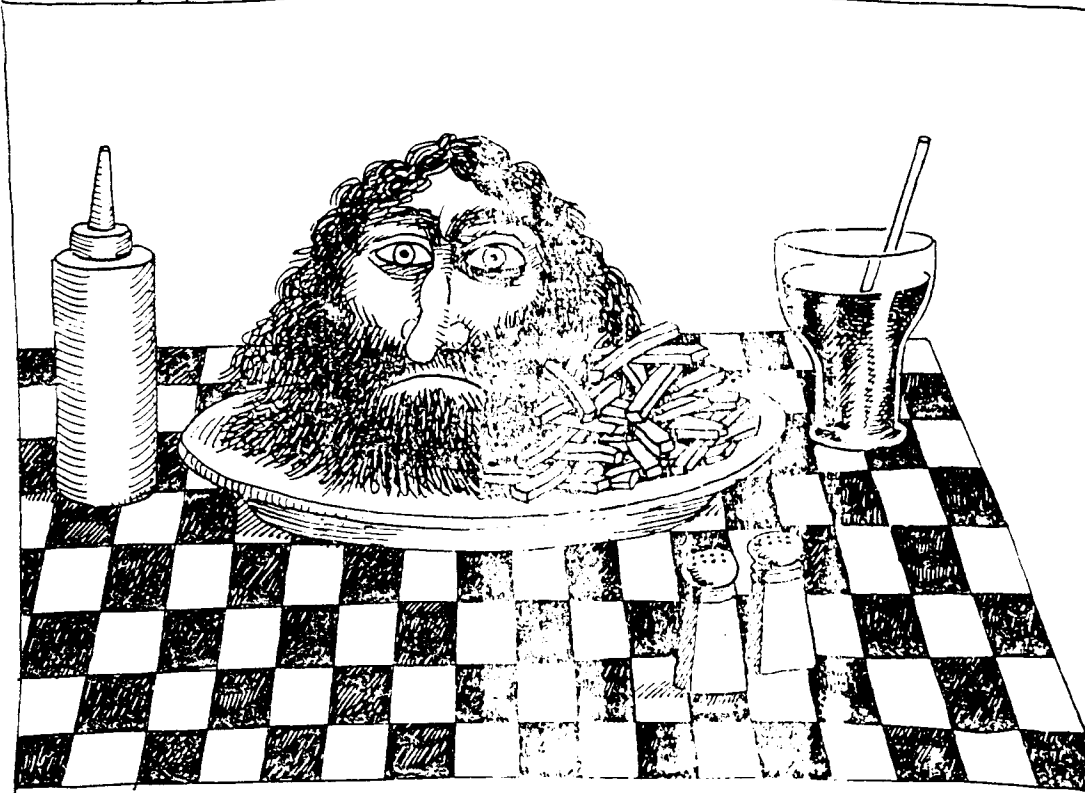
